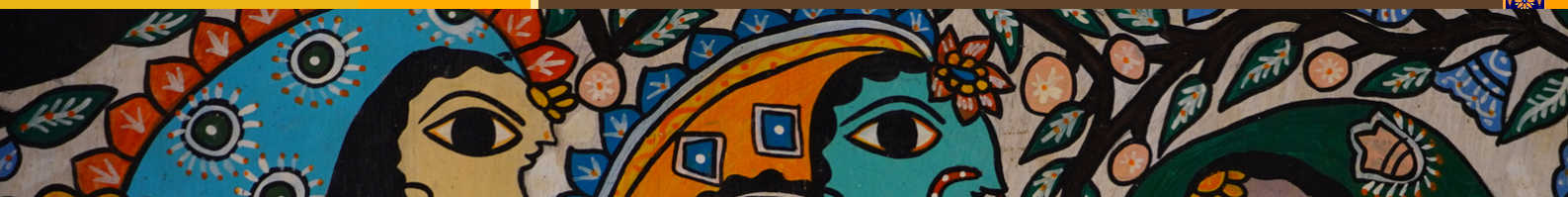

These measures have the potential to significantly enhance the quality and accessibility of education in Bihar.



Scheme to fulfill entrepreneur dream

Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar on Monday launched Small Business Scheme and also announced an online portal for the same. He also unveiled a book that highlighted the scheme and its incentives. Government of Bihar had conducted a caste census, in which more than 94 lakh poor families were identified, whose income is less than 6000. Under the scheme, one member of each family will be given two lakh rupees in three instalments to start a business.

Bihar Small Entrepreneur Scheme was launched with the theme 'हर घर उद्यमी, हर घर रोजगार, ऊँची उड़ान के लिए बिहार है तैयार (Entrepreneur in every household, employment in every household, Bihar is ready to fly high)'.

A boost to disaster management system in Bihar!

Hon'ble Chief Minister of Bihar, Shri Nitish Kumar, inaugurated the enhanced State Emergency Operations Center at Sardar Patel Bhavan on January 31, 2024. He also launched Decision Support System with an aim to make response on disasters quick and co-ordinated. Hon'ble CM expressed his happiness over the start of this new system and said that these disasters could be presumed and we can stay prepared to face them.



30 minutes to prepare for disaster

Hon'ble CM informed that an alerting device has been developed in collaboration with IIT Patna, which is unique in the world. Through this, laborers working in the field and people going out will wear this device on their body and they will start getting information about the disaster 30 minutes in advance, which will make them alert. This device can be charged by body heat itself. With the cooperation of Bihar Meteorological Center, it will give early warning not only in lightning but also in disasters like floods, excessive heat i.e. heat wave and cold wave. This pendant-shaped device has been named NITISH (Novel & Intense Technological Intervention for Saving Human lives) by Bihar State Disaster Management Authority. Its Hindi translation will be Neeti, Tivra and Shaktiashali Jeevan Suraksha Kavach (Nitish).

Advanced Cancer Ward in Patna

First of its Kind in Eastern India



On February 4th, Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar inaugurated a new Cancer Ward at Jayapraba Medanta Super Specialty Hospital in Patna. He also launched the state-of-the-art "Varian Edge Radiation Machine," a first-of-its-kind technology in Eastern India.

After the ceremony, Hon'ble CM Kumar toured the ward, inspecting Cath Labs, Endoscopy units, and Physiotherapy facilities. He received briefings on available services, observed the advanced machine's operation, and learned about its functionalities. Specialists reassured the Chief Minister of their commitment to providing comprehensive cancer care under one roof, offering swift diagnosis and immediate treatment options.



The "Varian Edge Radiation Machine" promises significant advancements in cancer treatment, making it the second in the nation and the first in Eastern India.

Agro Bihar 2024 Promotes Rooftop Gardening and Agricultural Innovation

The State-level Agricultural Mechanization Fair (Agro Bihar, 2024) was held at Gandhi Maidan from February 8th to 11th. Organized by the Department of Agriculture in collaboration with the CIAE, the event promoted rooftop gardening schemes in major Bihar cities.

The Additional Secretary flagged off promotional vehicles displaying green flags. These vehicles will raise awareness about the rooftop gardening schemes in Patna, Gaya, Muzaffarpur, and Bhagalpur. Participants can receive a subsidy of ₹37,500 per unit for open-area farming beds (300/600 square feet) on residential rooftops and ₹7,500 per unit (30 pots) for smaller-scale gardening.

The event was well-attended, with officials like Agricultural Director Dr. Alok Ranjan Ghosh and Horticulture Director Shri Abhishek Kumar present. Over 17,000 farmers and the public flocked to the fair on its opening day.

Agro Bihar 2024 featured over 140 stalls showcasing agricultural machinery, products, seeds, conservation techniques, digital crop surveying, and more. Prestigious institutions, including IIT Patna, the Bihar Agricultural University, and the Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University, participated. The fair also hosted a daily farmer school providing education on agricultural mechanization.



Simaria Dham stair ghat inaugurated, ushering in new era of progress



On February 16, 2023, during his Samadhan Yatra, Hon'ble CM Shri Nitish Kumar, announced the development of Simaria Dham. He laid the foundation stone for the project on May 30, 2023. Now, Hon'ble Chief Minister has officially inaugurated the newly constructed and beautified Simaria Dham Stair Ghat in the Begusarai district of Bihar. The Rs 115 crore project promises to significantly enhance the experience of pilgrims and visitors to this revered site. This development will also boost socio-economic progress in the region, generating local employment and furthering overall growth.

HON'BLE CM INAUGURATES HI-TECH PLANETARIUM

On Thursday, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Bihar, Shri Nitish Kumar, inaugurated the state-of-the-art Hi-Tech Planetarium. This modernization project, costing ₹73 crore 44 lakh 15 thousand, equips the planetarium with cutting-edge technology to showcase the wonders of the solar system.



Immersive Experiences: Visitors can now experience both 2D and 3D astronomical shows thanks to the upgraded projection system. The celluloid film system has been replaced with a modern mirage RGB (red, green, blue) pure laser projection system, creating an immersive and captivating experience. The upgraded auditorium comfortably accommodates 200 people, with push-back seats in the circular gallery ensuring optimal viewing angles. Additionally, a high-resolution dome-shaped hanging screen (16 meters in diameter) enhances the visual experience.



Bihar Government Appoints

2,133 Candidates to Boost Administrative and Educational Infrastructure

Bihar witnessed a significant development on February 15th as Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar distributed appointment letters to 2,133 candidates across various departments. This recruitment drive aimed to strengthen the state's administrative and educational sectors. The positions included Assistant Section Officers, Assistant Professors, and Lecturers within the Bihar Secretariat Service and the Department of Science, Technology, and Technical Education.

The event also saw a symbolic distribution of appointment letters to 50 candidates. Hon'ble Deputy Chief Ministers Shri Samrat Choudhary and Shri Vijay Kumar Sinha, Hon'ble Education Minister Shri Vijay Kumar Choudhary, and Hon'ble Science and Technology Minister Shri Sumit Kumar Singh were also present.

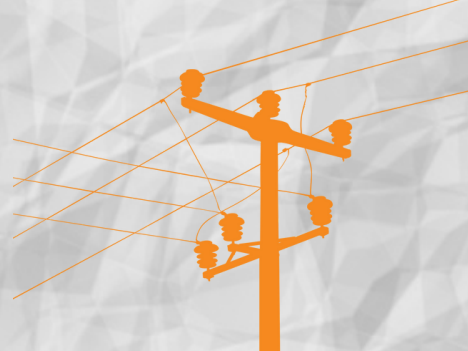


Bihar sets **national record** with over 26 lakh smart meters installed

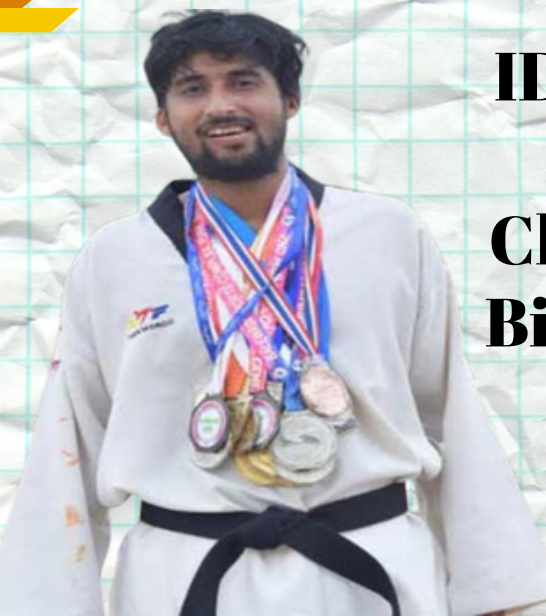
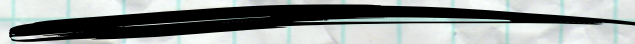




Shri Shams Aalam makes waves at Reykjavik Games, sets **National Records**

Bihar showcases textile opportunities at Bharat Tex 2024



The recently concluded Bharat Tex 2024, held from February 26th to 29th in New Delhi, witnessed Bihar showcasing its potential in the textile sector. Inspired by the government's 5-Fs vision - farm to foreign via fibre, fabric, fashion and focus, the state presented investment opportunities across the entire textile value chain.

Bihar's participation stemmed from the launch of its first-ever Textile and Leather Policy in 2022. This policy offers a range of incentives to attract investors, including capital grants, employment subsidies, power and freight cost assistance, and support for skill development and intellectual property. Additionally, the policy eases business setup through interest subventions, tax reimbursements, and exemptions from various fees and duties.

Through its presence at Bharat Tex 2024, Bihar aimed to connect with potential investors and establish itself as a rising hub for the textile and apparel industry.

NATIONAL ACADEMY OF MUSIC, DANCE, AND DRAMA AWARDS BIHAR ARTISTS

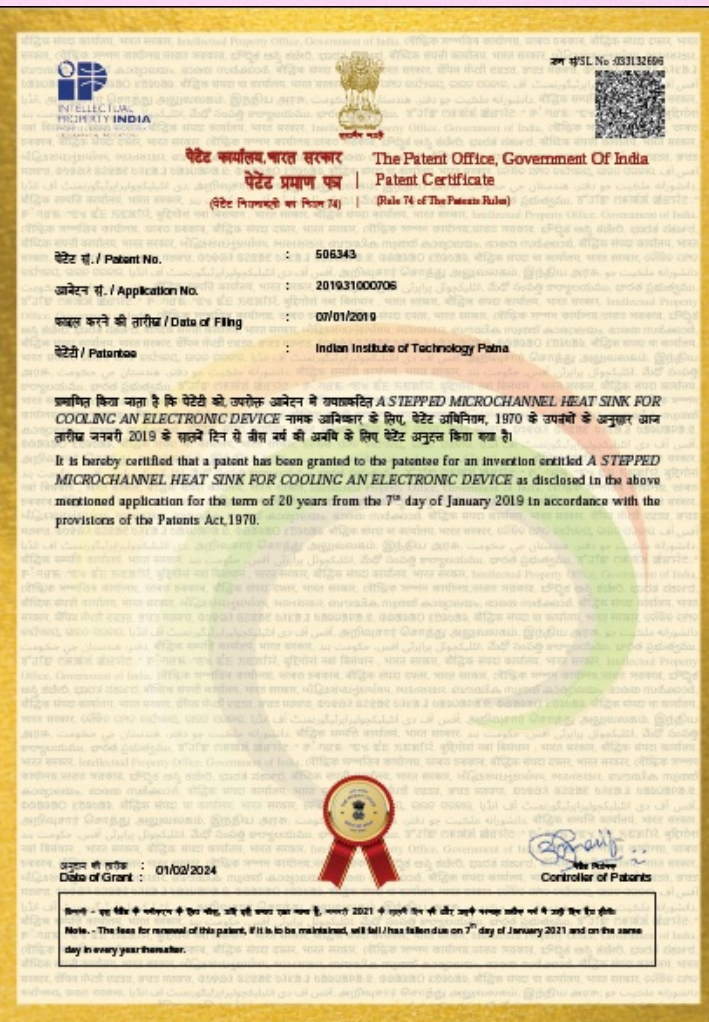

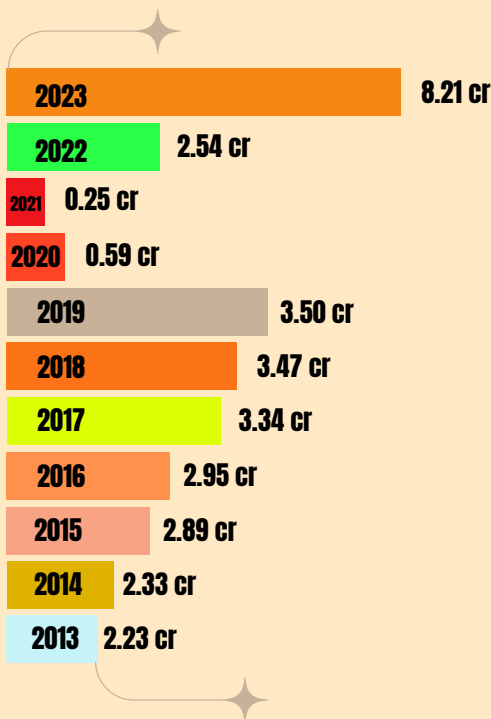

Jamui

A District Carved in Time

Nestled amidst the hills bordering Jharkhand, lies the vibrant district of Jamui in Bihar, India. Its formation, etched in history, took place on February 21st, 1991. Prior to this, Jamui was an integral part of the Munger district, but the year 1991 marked a significant milestone as it carved its own administrative identity.

With an area spanning roughly 3,122 square kilometers, Jamui boasts a rich tapestry of history, culture, and natural beauty. Dotted with hills and blessed with an average annual rainfall of 1,102 mm, the district holds immense potential for agricultural development. However, it also possesses a hidden treasure trove of resources like mica, coal, gold, and iron ore, waiting to be harnessed responsibly.

Beyond its geographical aspects, Jamui is steeped in a sense of historical significance. The town of Gidhaur, just 17 kilometers from the district headquarters, served as a seat of power during the British Raj. Even today, remnants of this era stand tall, with the Minto Tower serving as a marking structure to the architectural prowess of the time.

However, the journey since 1991 has not been without its challenges. The district has witnessed significant progress in recent years, with ongoing development initiatives aimed at improving infrastructure, promoting education, and fostering economic growth.

How to reach Jamui:

By Air: The nearest airport is located in Patna, approximately 160 kilometers away. Taxis and buses are readily available for onward travel to Jamui.

By Train: The district is well-connected by rail network to major cities like Patna, Gaya, and Kolkata.

By Road: National highways and state roads pass through the district, making it accessible by road from various parts of India.

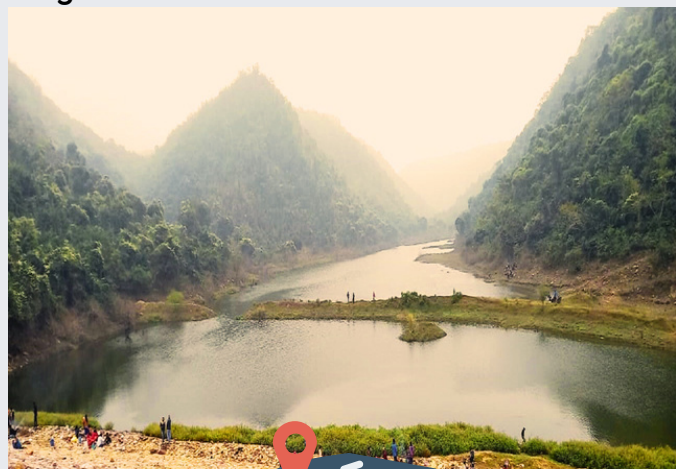
Places to See:
