# FROM THE DESK OF RESIDENT COMMISSIONER

Dear Readers,

I am pleased to present the February edition of Bihar Bhawan Newsletter, which highlights key developments in governance, public initiatives, cultural activities, and the observance of the 77th Republic Day.

During the month, several important events took place, including interactions of newly inducted Indian Foreign Service officers with the Hon'ble Governor, oath-taking ceremony of the new Chief Justice of the Patna High Court, and the conduct of Republic Day celebrations at Gandhi Maidan.

Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar undertook **Samriddhi Yatra** across the state to review ongoing development works and assess progress at the ground level. Hon'ble Chief Minister also participated in Makar Sankranti-related programmes during the month.

Industry and investment remained a key focus during this period. Bihar Cabinet approved several important policy measures, including the new Semiconductor Policy, incentive frameworks for multinational companies and Indian firms setting up Global Capability Centres (GCCs) in Bihar, and provisions for subsidised capital expenditure. Further strengthening the investment environment, State Investment Promotion Board (SIPB) approved 73 projects involving investments of several thousand crore rupees, while Project Clearance Committee (PCC) cleared projects amounting to several hundred crore rupees.

The state also witnessed notable youth-led initiatives in the areas of technology, innovation, and social enterprise. These included efforts in waste management, academic achievement at the national level, and Mt. Everest expedition on bicycle undertaken with limited resources. These developments reflect the outcomes of structured governance processes, supported by the state's ISO 9001:2015 certification.

Bihar Foundation continued its outreach activities through Makar Sankranti celebrations organised by its chapters at multiple locations, in line with its objectives of Bonding, Branding, and Business. In the national capital, a five-day Makar Sankranti programme showcased Bihar's art, culture, and cuisine. These activities were complemented by Bihar's participation in Bharat Parv as part of the 77th Republic Day celebrations.

Taken together, these developments indicate Bihar's continued progress across sectors.

Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar marked 77th Republic Day by unfurling the National Flag at his residence, 1 Anne Marg, and thereafter joined Hon'ble Governor of Bihar Shri Arif Mohammed Khan at the Republic Day parade held at Gandhi Maidan, Patna.

On the occasion of Republic Day, a flag hoisting ceremony was organised at Maranchi Mahadalit Tola under Akouna Gram Panchayat of Phulwarisharif block in Patna district. The National Flag was unfurled by senior citizen Shri Siddheshwar Manjhi Ji, in the presence of local residents and dignitaries.

The flag hoisting ceremony has been a regular feature in the Mahadalit Tola on both Independence Day and Republic Day since 2011. During the programme, announcements were made regarding several developmental schemes for the local area, and beneficiaries were extended support under various government initiatives.





# Samriddhi Yatra 2026 strengthens development momentum across Bihar

Samriddhi Yatra 2026, led by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Shri Nitish Kumar, reviewed and accelerated development works across multiple districts of Bihar, focusing on industry, infrastructure, livelihoods, education, healthcare, agriculture, women's empowerment, and ease of living.

The yatra began from West Champaran, where the Hon'ble Chief Minister visited the Kumarbagh Industrial Area in Chanpatia, inspected the upcoming CBG plant, reviewed the Special Economic Zone, inaugurated a Primary Processing Centre, laid the foundation stone of a working women's hostel, and interacted with entrepreneurs and Jeevika Didis, highlighting employment generation and local industrial growth.



At Bettiah, projects worth over ₹180 crore were inaugurated and initiated, alongside a Kisan Mela and agricultural machinery exhibition. A district review meeting emphasised fast-track implementation of schemes under Saat Nischay-2 and Saat Nischay-3, with special focus on Ease of Living through strengthened grievance redressal mechanisms.

In East Champaran (Motihari), the Hon'ble Chief Minister inspected the Women's Government ITI, where industry-supported skill training is enhancing employability, and inaugurated and laid foundation stones for projects worth over ₹170 crore.

The yatra continued through Sitamarhi and Sheohar, where major infrastructure projects including a high-level RCC bridge on the Bagmati River, education initiatives, and development works worth over ₹550 crore were launched, along with financial support to livelihood families and Jeevika self-help groups.

CM in Focus

In Gopalganj and Saran, flood protection, road connectivity, industrial link roads, and women-centric livelihood centres were reviewed and inaugurated. Development projects worth ₹538 crore in Saran further strengthened rural livelihoods and women's employment.

At Siwan, projects worth ₹202 crore were launched, including upgrades at the Government Medical College, Mairwa, and support to agriculture, food processing, and self-employment initiatives.

Muzaffarpur saw a major infrastructure push with projects worth over ₹850 crore, covering roads, bridges, ROBs, ring road, and redevelopment of the bus terminal, significantly improving regional connectivity.

In Vaishali, river desilting of Baya River, industrial land identification, power infrastructure, and water management works were reviewed to support flood control and economic development.

The yatra also covered Madhubani, Darbhanga, and Samastipur, focusing on urban infrastructure, industrial areas, transport hubs, tourism sites, education institutions, and heritage development, with large-scale projects launched across these districts.

Samriddhi Yatra 2026 reflects Bihar's continued journey towards balanced, inclusive, and region-wide development—ensuring growth reaches every district and strengthens opportunities for all.

The four-day national conference brought together physicians from across the country and featured deliberations on the latest research, advancements in medical science, and modern treatment practices, reflecting Bihar's growing role as a hub for academic and professional medical engagement.



# Bihar cabinet approves investor incentives, Semiconductor policy

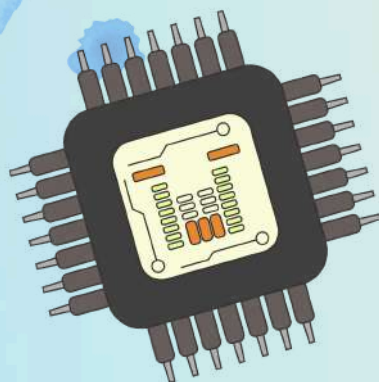


Patna, January 29: Bihar Cabinet approved a series of key decisions aimed at boosting investment, strengthening governance, and expanding women-led entrepreneurship in the state. The meeting, chaired under the leadership of Hon'ble CM Shri Nitish Kumar, cleared a total of 32 proposals.

To attract large-scale investment, the Cabinet approved incentive packages for multinational companies and Indian firms setting up Global Capability Centres (GCCs) in Bihar, as well as for semiconductor and electronic component manufacturing units. Subsidies linked to capital expenditure have been approved, with support capped at ₹50 crore for GCCs. Additional incentives include rental subsidies, R&D support, and salary-linked benefits, with higher incentives for employees holding Bihar domicile. For semiconductor units, state subsidies will complement central assistance, supporting projects involving investments of ₹10,000 crore or more.

## Decision on semiconductor policy

Semiconductors are central to modern technology, powering sectors such as healthcare, transport, communication, defence, and space. With India's semiconductor market projected to reach USD 100–110 billion by 2030, Bihar aims to emerge as an Eastern Technology Hub in line with national priorities and the vision of Saat Nischay 3.0 – Prosperous Industry, Empowered Bihar.



The Bihar Semiconductor Policy 2026 offers capital subsidies and key land-related incentives, including allotment of one acre of land at a token rate of ₹1 for every ₹100 crore of approved project cost. Units will also receive exemptions from stamp duty, registration charges, and land conversion fees, creating a supportive ecosystem for high-value, technology-driven investments in the state.



## Global Capability Centre (GCC) Policy

The Cabinet approved Bihar Global Capability Centre (GCC) Policy, 2026, aimed at attracting global and domestic companies to establish back-office, technology, analytics, finance, and research centres in the state. The policy seeks to leverage Bihar's young talent pool by promoting employment in knowledge-based services and IT-enabled sectors. Provisions under the policy focus on infrastructure support, incentives, and facilitation mechanisms to encourage companies to set up operations in Bihar, thereby strengthening the state's service economy and expanding skilled job opportunities.

## Mukhyamantri Mahila Rojgar Yojana

Under Mukhyamantri Mahila Rojgar Yojana, the Cabinet approved an increase in financial assistance for women entrepreneurs, raising the maximum support to ₹2 lakh. The enhanced assistance is intended to enable women to start or expand small businesses, particularly in micro and home-based enterprises. The decision reflects the government's emphasis on promoting women's economic independence, self-employment, and participation in local economic activities, especially in rural and semi-urban areas.

## Bihar State Marketing Authority (BSMA)

The Cabinet approved creation of Bihar State Marketing Authority (BSMA) to strengthen and streamline the marketing framework for agricultural, industrial, and allied products. The new authority is expected to bring better coordination in marketing systems, improve market access for producers, and support efficient price discovery. By consolidating oversight and planning, BSMA aims to modernise marketing practices, strengthen supply chains, and enhance the overall competitiveness of Bihar's produce in domestic and external markets.

## Big push for industry as SIPB approves 73 projects



In a significant step towards accelerating industrial investment in the state, a high-level meeting of the State Investment Promotion Board (SIPB) was successfully held on January 8, 2026. The meeting was jointly chaired by Shri Kundan Kumar, Secretary, Department of Industries, and Shri Mukul Kumar Gupta, Director of Industries.

During the meeting, 57 projects were granted Stage-I clearance, involving a proposed investment of ₹1,024.78 crore. In addition, 16 projects received financial approval, paving the way for further investment of ₹169.49 crore. Overall, 73 projects were approved.

Detailed deliberations were held on simplifying and expediting the investment approval process to make it more transparent and investor-friendly. Key challenges faced by investors during project implementation—such as land availability, statutory clearances, infrastructure support and inter-departmental coordination—were discussed, with emphasis on ensuring timely and effective administrative assistance.

Major investment proposals from companies including Silica Healthcare Pvt. Ltd., Leap Agri Logistics, and Gautam Trading & Co. were considered during the meeting. These projects are expected to boost industrial expansion while generating employment at the local level.





# BIADA Project Clearance Committee accelerates industrial growth



Project Clearance Committee (PCC) of Bihar Industrial Area Development Authority held two key meetings in January to expedite industrial development across the state. Chaired by Shri Kundan Kumar, Secretary, Industries and Managing Director, BIADA & IDA, the PCC reviewed and approved allotment of industrial plots and plug-and-play sheds to eligible applicants, reinforcing Bihar's push towards a diversified and robust industrial ecosystem.

**On January 14**, the PCC approved allotments to 11 industrial units across multiple industrial areas, covering 7.31 acres. These proposals are expected to attract investments of ₹116.27 crore and generate around 679 employment opportunities.

Subsequently, **on January 27**, approvals were granted to 25 industrial units spanning 12.5 acres, with projected investments of ₹168.52 crore and employment generation of approximately 1,194 jobs. Together, these approvals mark a significant step in boosting industrial activity, job creation, and economic growth in Bihar.

## IFS trainee officers interact with Industries Department on Bihar's investment potential

**Patna, January 22:** Five trainee officers of Indian Foreign Service (IFS) 2025 batch visited Industries Department, Government of Bihar, and interacted with Hon'ble Industries Minister, Shri Dilip Kumar Jaiswal, to gain insights into Bihar's industrial growth and investment potential. During the visit, the officers were briefed via a detailed presentation by Shri Kundan Kumar, Secretary, Industries Department, along with senior departmental officials. The presentation covered the state's industrial policy framework, initiatives for MSMEs and startups, investment facilitation mechanisms, and key upcoming projects.





## QR-based grievance system to enhance citizen services in Bihar

Bihar has introduced a new QR code-based grievance redressal system to further strengthen good governance and improve citizen services. The initiative will enable citizens to register their complaints by simply scanning a QR code, ensuring quicker access to concerned officials and reducing procedural delays. QR codes will be displayed at government offices, hospitals, and block and district-level premises. Through a simple online form, citizens can submit details of their grievances, upload supporting documents, and track progress using a unique registration number. Complaints will reach the dashboard of the concerned department and officer, helping ensure accountability and timely resolution.



## IIT graduate turns plastic waste into sustainable business opportunity

Patna, January 6: An IIT graduate, along with his brother, has built a successful startup by transforming plastic waste into valuable construction materials, offering a sustainable solution to one of today's biggest environmental challenges. Choosing innovation over conventional career paths, the young entrepreneur developed a structured model for plastic waste collection, segregation, and recycling. Using eco-friendly technology, the startup produces durable tiles, blocks, and other building materials while keeping pollution in check. The initiative also creates local employment by engaging communities in waste collection and processing. With plans to establish a manufacturing unit in Bihar, the venture is set to boost green industry in the state.

बता दें कि, दोनों उद्यमी प्लास्टिक वेस्ट को खुरसूरत और टिकाऊ उत्पादों में बदल रहे हैं। उनके द्वारा बनाए गए आइडम्स में प्लास्टिक शीट्स, डाइनिंग टेबल, मिश्रित हैपर, इको फैंटर्स, लेवर्टी स्टैंड और डेस्क ऑर्गनाइजर शामिल हैं। इनके उत्पादों की गुणवत्ता का अंदाजा इस बात से लगाया जा सकता है कि इन उत्पादों पर भवन के सुविनिवेश शीट में भी जगह मिली है। प्लास्टिक वेस्ट से बनी उत्पाद यहाँ से खरीदी जा सकती है। इसके अलावा, उन्होंने 'खोली ड्रिप्स' के लिए भी विशेष उत्पाद तैयार किए हैं, खासकर मेडल।

दोनों भाइयों का लक्ष्य सिर्फ उत्पाद बनाना नहीं है, बल्कि पर्यावरण संरक्षण और जलवायु परिवर्तन के बारे में जागरूकता फैलाना भी है। इस उद्देश्य से वे 'प्लास्टिक के चर्च' अभियान चला रहे हैं, राहुल बताते हैं कि अगर उन्हें सरकार से सहयोग मिलता है, तो वे जल्द ही अपने गृह राज्य में एक बड़ा प्लांट स्थापित करेंगे।



## GAD receives ISO 9001:2015 certification for governance reforms

**Patna, January 21:** Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar was presented a certificate of ISO 9001:2015 International Quality Standard at Sankalp, 1 Anne Marg, in recognition of institutional reforms and innovations undertaken by the General Administration Department of the Bihar Government. The certificate was handed over by representatives of Indian Register Quality Systems (IRQS).



The General Administration Department has been awarded the ISO 9001:2015 certification for its sustained efforts over the past three years towards workplace modernisation, streamlining of processes, comprehensive improvement in departmental functioning, enhanced transparency, and adoption of innovative practices. The certification, formally granted on January 12, 2026, is valid until 2029.

## Bihar receives national award in civil aviation

**Patna, January 31:** Bihar has been conferred a national award at Wings India 2026 event, organised by the Ministry of Civil Aviation, for its remarkable progress in civil aviation sector, visionary policy reforms, and infrastructure development. The award recognises sustained and effective efforts of the Government of Bihar to strengthen aviation connectivity in the state. Union Civil Aviation Minister Ram Mohan Naidu presented the award to Secretary, Civil Aviation Department, Bihar, Dr Nilesh Ramchandra Deore. The state reaffirmed its commitment to developing safe, affordable, accessible and inclusive air connectivity, supported by key reforms such as the reduction of VAT on Aviation Turbine Fuel from 30 per cent to 4 per cent.

Along the way, injuries to his legs and hands tested his resolve, yet he pushed forward, refusing to give up.

Completing the journey has strengthened his belief that perceived limits can be overcome. Shri Ritesh Kumar Jha now hopes to emerge as a youth icon, inspiring others to step forward and attempt what may seem impossible—proving that determination and self-belief can take one to the highest places on earth.

# FROM A BIHAR VILLAGE TO IIT: A 13-YEAR-OLD'S IMPOSSIBLE DREAM

At 13, most children worry about homework and school exams. Satyam Kumar did something extraordinary—he cleared the IIT-JEE and created history. From a small village in Bihar to becoming the youngest IITian in India, his journey proves that talent, when guided by belief and hard work, knows no age.

Satyam was born in Bakhorapur, a small village in the Bhojpur district of Bihar. He came from a humble farming family, with no elite educational background or shortcuts to success. However, his father noticed early on that Satyam had an exceptional ability to learn and grasp concepts quickly. This natural aptitude became the foundation of a remarkable journey.

On the advice of a relative, Satyam was sent to Kota to prepare for the IIT-JEE, one of the toughest competitive examinations in the country, attempted by over fifteen lakh students every year. While most aspirants spend several years in preparation, Satyam appeared for the exam at the age of just twelve in 2012 and secured an All India Rank of 8137. For many, this would have been the end of the road, but for Satyam, it was only the beginning.

In 2013, at the age of thirteen, Satyam appeared for the IIT-JEE again and stunned the nation by securing an All India Rank of 670 with an impressive score of 292 out of 360. This achievement made him the youngest IITian in Indian history and brought him nationwide recognition.

Satyam went on to join Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur, where he pursued a dual degree in Electrical Engineering. His growth was not limited to classrooms alone. He actively engaged in advanced research, explored robotics and machine learning, and worked on brain-interface studies. His dedication to innovation led to the publication of three research papers at a very young age.
