



LORD BUDDHA'S TEACHINGS: A UNIVERSAL TREASURE UNITING INDIA AND THAILAND



"Lord Buddha's teachings were not just India's treasure but a gift to the entire world. There was no distinction between Sanatan and Buddhist philosophies. India and Thailand have always been spiritually united and the world would increasingly embrace Lord Buddha's principles in the future," said His Excellency Governor of Bihar (former), Shri Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar at a welcome ceremony for the Thai delegation of the fourth Mekong-Ganga Dhammayatra, held at Raj Bhavan on December 2.

His Excellency shared his February 2024 visit to Thailand, recalling the emotional connection of Thai people to the sacred relics of Lord Buddha and his disciples, Arhat Sariputta and Arhat Maudgalyayana. The relics were displayed across four provinces for 25 days, where devotees felt Buddha's divine presence.

Hon'ble CM Shri Nitish Kumar flags off 109 free medicine vehicles



Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar on December 12 flagged off 109 free medicine vehicles from 1 Anne Marg. These vehicles aimed to improve the distribution of free medicines and enhance healthcare services.

The objective of this program is to ensure timely availability of medicines at all government health institutions, especially in remote areas, so that no citizen is deprived of health benefits due to unavailability of medicines. This effort by the government represents a significant step towards providing better healthcare services to every citizen, particularly the poor and marginalized communities. The GPS-equipped medicine vehicles are part of the 'Swasth Bihar' mission, which aims to improve the living standards of the most vulnerable groups in society.

Hon'ble CM launches 'Hamara Bihar, Hamari Sadak' mobile app

Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar on December 19, launched 'Hamara Bihar, Hamari Sadak' mobile app from 'Sankalp' at 01, Anne Marg, Patna. This Android-based mobile app has been developed under the Rural Works Department.

Hon'ble CM said that this advanced technology would not only improve transportation in rural areas but also accelerate the development with public infrastructure active participation. He also urged authorities to promptly address complaints received from the public.



'Hamara Bihar, Hamari Sadak' app enables public to report road-related issues such as potholes, damaged edges, and other concerns directly to the department. The app, available across the state, offers an accessible platform for citizens to share road maintenance problems. Users can upload details and photos of any road's poor condition.

The app provides a comprehensive list of 65,000 kilometers of rural roads under maintenance across all blocks in the state. Users can select their block, report issues like potholes, and upload photos. Once a complaint is registered, the concerned authorities are required to resolve the issue within a stipulated timeframe and update the resolution status on the app. After resolving the issue, officials will upload pictures of the repaired site, ensuring transparency in the maintenance and repair process for rural roads.


HON'BLE CM SHRI NITISH KUMAR FLAGS OFF 43 DELUXE BUSES

Hon'ble CM Shri Nitish Kumar Inaugurates Bihar Sports Talent Hunt



Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar inaugurated Mashaal, the world's largest sports talent hunt competition, on December 9 at the Indoor Stadium of Pataliputra Sports Complex, Kankarbagh.

During the inauguration, Hon'ble CM awarded seven exceptional athletes scholarships under Bihar Sports Scholarship Scheme, providing ₹20 lakh annually for advanced training. In addition, he distributed sports kits to the participants, emphasizing the government's unwavering support for aspiring athletes.

Mashaal is an initiative by Bihar government to foster a strong sports culture and empower athletes from across the state. This ambitious competition seeks to identify and nurture talented school and non-school athletes, equipping them with the training and resources needed to excel at national and international platforms, including the 2032 and 2036 Olympics.

The talent hunt will witness participation from approximately 60 lakh athletes across 40,000 government secondary and higher secondary schools, as well as talented non-school athletes. The multi-tiered competition will be conducted at block, district, divisional, and state levels, covering key disciplines such as athletics, kabaddi, football, and volleyball. Events under athletics include running, long jump, and cricket ball throw.

The competition is categorized for boys and girls under 14 and under 16, aiming to create a robust pipeline of skilled athletes.



NBPDCL wins first prize at India's National Energy Conservation Awards-2024

North Bihar Power Distribution Company Limited (NBPDCL) has been awarded the first prize in the National Energy Conservation Awards-2024 for its exceptional energy conservation efforts in the DISCOM sector under the "Institutions" category.

Shri Nilesh Deore, Managing Director of NBPDCL and senior IAS officer, received the award from His Excellency Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar at a ceremony held at Vigyan Bhawan. The awards were presented during the annual Energy Conservation Day celebrations on December 14 in Delhi, recognizing achievements across multiple sectors, including industry, transport, buildings, and institutions, in promoting energy conservation.

In addition to this recognition, NBPDCL's efforts have been further acknowledged with the National Award for Best DISCOM by the Ministry of Power (MoP). Over the past six months, the company successfully installed 16 lakh smart meters, covering 30% of its consumer base, marking a significant step toward digitalization and improved efficiency in power distribution.



Bihar Business Connect 2024 marks historic milestone with MoUs worth Rs 1.8 lakh crore signed

423 MoUs with companies across multiple sectors



Bihar Business Connect 2024 concluded on a high note, achieving a historic milestone for the state's industrial growth. The event commenced with a ceremonial lamp lighting by Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister Shri Vijay Kumar Sinha, who graced the occasion as Chief Guest. Distinguished government dignitaries in attendance included Shri Nitish Mishra, Hon'ble Industries and Tourism Minister; Shri Bijendra Prasad Yadav, Hon'ble Energy Minister; Shri Amrit Lal Meena, Chief Secretary, Government of Bihar; Shri Deepak Kumar, Secretary to the Chief Minister and Shri Pratyaya Amrit, Development Commissioner.

BBC 2024 saw signing of several landmark Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) between Bihar and leading companies, marking a transformative step for the state's industrial landscape. A total of 423 MoUs were signed, amounting to an impressive Rs 1.8 lakh crore—three times the amount signed last year. The renewable energy sector saw the highest investment, with Sun Petro Chemicals pledging Rs 36,700 crore and NHPC contributing Rs 5,500 crore. In the food processing industry, SLMG Beverages (Coca-Cola) and Haldiram's Snacks Pvt. Ltd. committed Rs 3,000 crore and Rs 300 crore, respectively. Additionally, Shree Cement committed Rs 800 crore for general manufacturing.

To further streamline the grievance redressal process, a Grievance Tab has been introduced on the BIADA website, and a dedicated mobile app is under development to make it easier for entrepreneurs to resolve issues efficiently.

India's First Battery Management System Technology Developed with IIT Patna and Bihar Government Collaboration



In a significant achievement, Amossys Portable Power LLP, under the mentorship of the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Patna and with the collaboration of Government of India and Bihar's Department of Industries, has developed India's first Battery Management System (BMS) technology. This technology is considered essential for the operational safety of lithium-ion batteries (LIB) and LIB packs, which are critical for electric vehicles (EVs) and various commercial applications. The BMS technology is also valuable for defense applications in diverse environmental conditions, including low-temperature regions. On December 12, the first international consignment of inverters based on the BMS technology was dispatched from IIT Patna's Incubation Center to Nigeria (Africa).

Chief Secretary reviews key industrial developments in Muzaffarpur and Hajipur



Chief Secretary of Bihar, Shri Amrit Lal Meena, visited the Bag Cluster and Textile Park in the Industrial Area Bela, Muzaffarpur, on December 12. 
