Industries continue to thrive, with the Chief Secretary inaugurating a new apparel unit in Bihta. Meanwhile, BIADA allocated land worth hundreds of crores to facilitate establishment of new industrial units across the state.

Several individuals from Bihar made the state proud with remarkable achievements in diverse fields, continuing to inspire the next generation.

PM Modi launches ₹13,480 crore development projects in Bihar's Madhubani

Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, in the presence of Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar, inaugurated and laid foundation stones for development projects worth over ₹13,480 crore in Madhubani, Bihar, on April 24, during National Panchayati Raj Day celebrations.



Hon'ble PM presented National Panchayat Awards and launched key initiatives across multiple sectors, including:

- Foundation stone for an LPG bottling plant with rail unloading facility in Gopalganj (₹340 crore).
- Power sector projects worth over ₹6,200 crore, including infrastructure upgrades under the Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme.
- Flagging off new trains including Amrit Bharat Express (Saharsa-Mumbai) and Namo Bharat Rapid Rail (Jaynagar-Patna), and inaugurating rail lines and bridges to improve connectivity.
- Grih Pravesh of 1 lakh PMAY-G and 54,000 PMAY-U houses in Bihar.
- Distribution of ₹930 crore in Community Investment Funds to over 2 lakh SHGs under DAY-NRLM.
- Sanction letters to 15 lakh new PMAY-Gramin beneficiaries and release of instalments to 10 lakh more across India.







HE Governor of Bihar, Shri Arif Khan, unveiled Mohammad Bhojpuri Folk Art Calendar on April 5 at Durbar Hall, Raj Bhavan. On the occasion, HE Governor said that while diversity has often been seen as a challenge in many countries, in India it has always been a strength that has reinforced our unity. He emphasized that our culture diversity thrives on and perhaps the only one in the world rooted in the concept of plurality.



The concept of a calendar, he said, emerged long after the Rigveda, and in Indian tradition, the perception of time is cyclical. A calendar symbolizes change, and understanding history is essential to advance civilization and culture.

Bihar's First-Ever Air Show: A Historic Tribute to Heroism



On the occasion of Vijay Diwas, commemorating the valor of Babu Veer Kunwar Singh, Bihar witnessed a historic and awe-inspiring moment — its first grand air show. Held along the scenic JP Ganga Path in Patna, this event brought together citizens, dignitaries, and the Indian Armed Forces in a powerful celebration of bravery, patriotism, and aviation excellence.



The Indian Air Force's elite 'Surya Kiran' Aerobatic Team delivered a spectacular aerial performance that left thousands of spectators in awe. Taking off from the Bihta Airbase, nine fighter jets soared into the Patna sky, executing precise, synchronized manoeuvres at altitudes reaching up to 1,000 feet. The daring aerobatics, marked by flawless formations and high-speed stunts, created an electrifying atmosphere along the JP Ganga Path.



The event was graced by Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister Shri Samrat Choudhary, and other dignitaries.



'Mahila Samuad' to empower 2 cr women across the State



Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar inaugurated **Mahila Samvad** (Women's Dialogue) campaign on Friday, April 18, by flagging off 50 awareness vehicles from Patna. The campaign aims at informing women across Bihar about government welfare schemes and empowering them socially and economically.

Over 60 days, events will be conducted at 70,000 locations, with 600 specially designated vehicles reaching out to women in rural areas. The government aims to directly connect with approximately 2 crore women through this initiative, including over 1.35 lakh members of the Jeevika self-help groups.

The campaign will spread awareness about several key initiatives such as Women Empowerment Policy 2015, prohibition, reservation, dowry eradication, child marriage prevention, Mukhyamantri Kanya Utthan Yojana, School Uniform Scheme, and Jeevika.



"Aapka Shehar Aapki Baat" - Strengthening Civic Dialogue

Urban Development and Housing Department, Govt. of Bihar, launched Aapka Shehar Aapki Baat initiative. Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar inaugurated the program via video conferencing, providing clear directions for its effective implementation across the state. Describing it as a vital link in public dialogue, Hon'ble CM emphasized that this initiative serves not only to understand the ground realities of various schemes but also offers citizens a direct channel to connect with the government.



Bihar sets world records for largest Madhubani painting & bowl ensemble

Bihar has made history by winning not one, but two Guinness World Records - a proud moment for the state just before Khelo India Youth Games 2025. On April 27 (Sunday), Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar received official certificates at Patliputra Sports Complex in Patna.



The first record was for the largest Madhubani painting, created by 50 women artists from the Mithila Chitrakala Sansthan. Led by Padma Shri awardee Baua Devi, they completed the stunning artwork—measuring over 201 square feet—in just 50 hours using only natural colors. This painting will be displayed during the opening of the Khelo India Games.

The second record was set in Bodh Gaya, where 375 Buddhist monks from different monasteries performed together with singing bowls, chanting the Buddha Mantra. Their peaceful and powerful performance broke the earlier record held by 100 lamas. The event highlighted Bihar's spiritual heritage as the 'Land of Enlightenment.'





These records are not just world achievements—they are a celebration of Bihar's culture, talent, and progress on the global stage.





In a historic move, Bihar will be hosting **Khelo India Youth Games** for the very first time in 2025. This milestone event will bring together thousands of athletes from across the nation, marking a significant step in promoting sports culture and empowering the youth of the state.

Logo Unveiling: Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar revealed the official logo for Khelo India Youth Games 2025.

Mascot Launch: The official mascot was remotely launched by Hon'ble Union Minister of Labour & Employment and Youth Affairs & Sports, Shri Mansukh Mandaviya.

Sports Anthem & Torch Relay: Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Union Minister also released official sports anthem and flagged off Khelo India Torch Relay – Gaurav Yatra.

- Inauguration Date: Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will inaugurate the Games in Patna on May 4, 2025.
- Event Dates: The Games will take place from May 4 to May 15, 2025.
- Host Locations: The event will be held in Delhi and across five Bihar districts: Patna, Nalanda (Rajgir), Gaya, Bhagalpur, and Begusarai.
- Participants: 8,500 athletes and 1,500 technical staff from all over the country will compete in 28 sporting disciplines, totaling 10,000 participants.

Bihar's BOSS Baby!



Vaibhav Suryavanshi from Bihar made history by scoring a century in just 35 balls in the Indian Premier League (IPL). With this achievement, Shri Vaibhav has become the fastest Indian to score a century in IPL history, breaking Yusuf Pathan's previous record of 37 balls. Hon'ble CM Shri Nitish Kumar announced Rs 10 lakh cash prize for him.

Youngest player to score a century in T20 format

Shri Vaibhay has also etched his name in record books by becoming the youngest player ever to score a century in T20 cricket - at just 14 years and 32 days old. Prior to this, the record was held by Maharashtra's Vijay Zol, who had scored a T20 century at the age of 18 years and 118 days.

Youngest cricketer to earn an IPL contract

Shri Vaibhav Suryavanshi holds distinction of being the youngest player ever to earn an IPL contract. He was signed by Rajasthan Royals for ₹1.1 crore in 2025 IPL auction. At just 13 years old, he made his first-class debut for Bihar in the Ranji Trophy.

Other feats...

Shri Vaibhay has also represented India at Under-19 level. In a four-day match against Australia, he scored a century off just 58 balls. He was a key member of Indian squad that reached the final of the 2024 ACC Under-19 Asia Cup, scoring 176 runs at an average of 44. Adding to his list of achievements, Shri Vaibhay also has a triple century to his name - an unbeaten 332 in the Under-19 Randhir Verma Tournament held in Bihar.



Back in Time with Shri Vaibhav Suryavanshi in Samastipur

In 2018, during a brief visit to Samastipur, Shri Kundan Kumar (IAS) had met young and promising cricketer, Shri Vaibhav Suryavanshi, at the nets with his dedicated coach, Brajesh—who had then called him a "prodigy." Now, in 2025, Vaibhav has lived up to that promise and proven those words true.



Another shining example from the district is Shri **Anukul Roy**, a talented spinner who represented India in the U-19 World Cup and played in the IPL. During his tenure as Collector of Samastipur, Shri Kundan Kumar worked actively to promote sports, and it is heartening to see these young athletes now thriving on the national stage.

Bihar duo bags Gold at National Deaf Badminton Championship



On March 24, 2025, Shri Ritik Anand from Hajipur and Shri Ankur Srivastava from Patna made the state proud by winning gold medal at National Deaf Badminton Championship held in Ahmedabad. In a dominant display of skill and teamwork, Ritik and Ankur defeated Rajasthan's Abhinav Sharma and Piyush in straight sets in Boys' Doubles category. They took control of the match early, securing first set 21–07 with ease. The second set was more competitive, but the Bihar pair held their nerve to win 21–19 and clinch the title.



Shri Shailesh Kumar from Islamnagar, Aliganj block, Jamui district, has brought national pride through his achievements in paraathletics. He won a gold medal at an International Olympiad and another gold in high jump at Khelo India Para Games 2025.

Master Rudra Pratap Singh sets world record in powerlifting

Master Rudra Pratap Singh, a six-year-old boy from Kaimur district, has stunned the nation by setting a new world record in powerlifting. He lifted an impressive 45 kilograms during an event held in Agartala, the capital of Tripura, on April 9, Wednesday. His remarkable feat has been officially recognized by the India World Records. Master Rudra Pratap Singh is son of Shri Dharmendra Kumar Singh, popularly known as "Hammer Headman" of Ramgarh in Kaimur.



Apparel Manufacturing Unit Inaugurated in Sikandarpur, Bihta



Sikandarpur in Bihta is quickly becoming an important center for industry in Bihar. On April 18, the area reached a major milestone with the inauguration of a modern apparel manufacturing unit by R.K. Industries. The ceremony was led by Shri Amrit Lal Meena, Chief Secretary of Bihar at Sikandarpur Industrial Area. This new facility is a key step in Bihar's efforts to boost industrial growth and create more job opportunities. It is expected to provide employment to many people in the region, especially women from nearby communities, supporting both economic development and social progress.

BIADA allots land to 17 units across 12 Industrial Areas

To support Bihar's growing industrial sector, the Project Clearance Committee of Bihar Industrial Area Development Authority (BIADA), led by Shri Kundan Kumar, IAS, Managing Director, has approved land and shed allotments to 17 companies in 12 different industrial areas. A total of 11.22 acres of land has been allotted.

These projects cover important sectors such as food processing, textiles, IT, IT-enabled services, general manufacturing, and e-waste management. Together, they are expected to bring in investments worth ₹131.6 crores and create around 2,361 new jobs in the state.

Free office space for IT entrepreneurs:



On April 7, 2025, Department of Information Technology, Govt. of Bihar, has given free office space to 10 new startups at Biscomaun Bhawan, which is slowly turning into a dedicated IT Park. Hon'ble IT Minister Shri Krishna Kumar Mantu handed over the office keys to young business owners. This move is part of the Bihar IT Policy 2024, which aims to support new businesses. So far, the policy has attracted investment proposals worth ₹4,000 crore and offers benefits like money for setting up offices and help in creating jobs.

Three startups from Bihar win award at Startup Mahakumbh



At Startup Mahakumbh held at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, three Bihar-based startups—EY Delta, Ladyfair, and Bhojpatta—were awarded Maharathi Award, each receiving ₹1 lakh for their remarkable innovations. Ladyfair empowers rural women through home-based beauty services, employing over 150 women and generating ₹36 crore in annual revenue. Bhojpatta, an agritech startup, uses eco-friendly solar dryers to repurpose agricultural waste and supports rural livelihoods with an annual turnover of ₹89 lakh. EY Delta specializes in advanced electric motor technology for defense and space, securing a ₹3.5 crore order and marking Bihar's rising presence in India's startup ecosystem.

Purnea sets up high-tech Makhana plant, exports reach global markets







Purnea has marked a major milestone in Bihar's industrial growth with establishment of one of the most advanced and automated makhana processing facilities in the region. Spread over 55,000 square feet at BIADA Plug & Play complex in Maranga, the facility is equipped with cutting-edge technology and currently has a production capacity of 1,000 tons—expandable to 2,500 tons. This modern plant is transforming local makhana industry by ensuring consistent quality, value addition and global competitiveness. As a result, premium flavored makhana from Purnea is now being exported to key international markets including the United States, Canada, Singapore, and Australia.

Bihar tops nation in PMFME scheme


Under visionary leadership of Hon'ble CM Shri Nitish Kumar, Bihar continues to script new chapters of success, setting benchmarks in the implementation of central government schemes. Bihar has secured the first position nationwide in annual performance under Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) scheme, as recognized by Ministry of Food Processing Industries, Govt. of India.



In a letter issued by Additional Secretary Shri Minhaj Alam, it was highlighted that Bihar not only achieved 93% of its target for 2024–25 by approving 10,270 out of 11,000 units but also surpassed its 2023–24 target by an impressive 153 percent, approving 10,284 units against a target of 6,516.

In rural areas of West Champaran, JEEViKA's "Didi Ki Library" is changing how students learn and prepare for their future. Running in four blocks—Lauriya, Bagaha, Chanpatia, and Nautan—these libraries offer free high-speed internet, plenty of books, and a modern study environment.

Every day, 50 to 60 students visit to read, take part in debates, and sharpen their reasoning skills. So far, more than 7,000 students have benefited from this initiative.

Supported by World Bank, the project aims to close education gaps in rural communities by building a strong network of libraries that support learning and career growth. Plans are underway to expand to more blocks in the district.

Scientist from Bihar helps develop new drug to treat life-threatening pneumonia



Dr Aditya Shekhar, a researcher based in Germany and a native of Bihar, has played a key role in a major scientific breakthrough in pneumonia treatment. As part of an international research team, he helped develop a new drug that targets severe pneumonia caused by the bacterium Staphylococcus aureus. Unlike regular antibiotics that kill bacteria directly, this new drug takes a different approach. It neutralises a harmful toxin released by the bacteria—the same toxin that damages lung cells. By blocking this toxin, the drug makes the bacteria harmless and greatly reduces the severity of the infection.

This important achievement was shared by Dr Aditya's father, Dr Gyanendu Shekhar, a senior orthopaedic specialist at Sadar Hospital in Muzaffarpur. The research has been published in the respected Cell Press journal, and the team has already secured a patent for the drug.

Exotic Mangoes now grown in Bagaha!



Bagaha in Bihar is now home to some of world's the rarest and most expensive mangoes. This year, people in Bagaha can enjoy Japan's famous Miyazaki mango and Thailand's rare Black Kasturi mango. These fruits were once only grown in other countries, but now a few Indian farmers are growing them too. One of them is Shri Kalyan Shukla from Mangalpur village. He has planted these special mangoes on acre of land, bringing about one international flavors to local soil.

BAU develops new seedless tomato variety



Bihar Researchers at Agricultural University (BAU), Sabour in Bhagalpur district, have created a new seedless tomato variety. This tomato has more pulp and lasts longer, making it ideal for the food processing industry. BAU is working to help farmers earn more by promoting better crop varieties. As part of this effort, they encouraging farmers to move from old seed types to newer, climatefriendly ones. This seedless tomato is one of BAU's latest innovations and is expected to offer many benefits to farmers.


